
Home for the Holidays 2021






Be sure to keep your pups (and kitties) safe during the holiday season. Consider these *seven tips to help prevent an emergency vet visit:

- 1. Keep people food out of the reach of your pet, and ask your guests to do the same.
- 2. Ensure your pet doesn't have access to treats, especially those containing chocolate, xylitol, grapes/raisins, onions, or other toxic foods.
- 3. Don't leave your pet alone in the room with lit candles, a decorated tree, or potpourri.
- 4. Keep holiday plants (holly, mistletoe, and lilies) out of reach of pets.
- 5. Consider leaving tinsel off your tree if you have a cat.
- 6. Secure your Christmas tree to keep it from falling over if your dog bumps it or your cat climbs it. Hanging lemon-scented air fresheners in the tree may deter your cat from climbing it.
- 7. Provide a safe place (such as a kennel, crate, perching place, scratching post shelf, or hiding spot) for your pet to escape the excitement if you're entertaining guests. If your pet is excitable or scared, consider putting your pet in another room with toys and a comfortable bed.

Candy making in our family started with a great-great-grandfather in England and has been passed down from generation to generation. As a small child, I watched my grandmother, mother, and aunt melt chocolate and make pounds and pounds of candy as Christmas gifts for family, friends, and neighbors. When they were finished, we children were allowed to take turns getting into the chocolate and dipping some of the candy. Nothing felt as good as chocolate all over our hands. When we finished, we licked our fingers. Little did I know that those experiences would be the beginning of a life's work for me. These holiday gifts led to the opening of our first store. Today, my grandchildren get excited when they get their hands into the chocolate and cover sweet creations to share with members of their families. And so the tradition continues.

Rocky Road Fudge

4 cups sugar 1 can evaporated milk 1/2 cup corn syrup 1/2 lb. mini marshmallows

2 cups pecan pieces 2 tsp. vanilla

1/2 lb. butter 12 oz. dark chocolate

1/2 lb. frozen mini marshmallows

Mix sugar, canned milk, corn syrup, and 1/2 lb. marshmallows in a cooking kettle. Cook on medium-low heat, bringing to a boil and cook for 6 minutes, stirring continually, marshmallows will scorch otherwise. Remove from heat and let cool for 10 minutes. Add melted butter and chocolate and mix well. Add pecan pieces and vanilla. Mix well. Add frozen marshmallows and mix. Pour into a pan lined with freezer wrap paper.

Caramel for Pecan Logs

2 cups sugar Itsp. vanilla 1/4 tsp. salt

11/4 cup light karo syrup

11/2 cup light cream (Can substitute part Combine sugar, salt, syrup, and 1/2 cup cream in a pan. Stir until dissolved. Cook to 228°F. Add the other 1/2 cup cream in a pan. Stir until the last 1/2 cup cream and cook to 234°F. Lower heat and stir as caramel thickens or it will stick and burn. Stir in vanilla.

Put a small dollop of the caramel into ice cold water and put in the fridge for I to 2 minutes to cool. Once cool, check the firmness of the caramel. By doing this starting at about 230°F, you can find the desired consistency. Mold nougat into bars and place in freezer. When caramel is ready, dip nougat

into caramel mixture. Roll in chopped pecans and return to the freezer until caramel hardens. This won't take long. When set, wrap in waxed paper. NOTE: It takes about 2 lbs. Pecans to cover the batch of fondant. Batch can be doubled. Single batch makes about 20 rolls. Make 11/2 batches of caramel to dip one

Penuche Fudge

2 cups white sugar ITbsp. butter

11/2 cups whipping cream 2 cups brown sugar

2 tsp. light corn syrup Combine all ingredients in a pan and stir until dissolved. Continue to stir occasionally while cooking. Place lid on kettle when it starts to boil, for about a minute, as this dissolves the fine sugar crystals on the sides of the pan. Cook to soft ball stage, about 230°F, when tested in cold water. Place butter in the center of the pan and pour candy over it. DO NOT scrape the pan; let candy drip out. When cool, beat with a fork until it can be molded with the lower part of the hand. If it should be cooked too hard, a small amount of cream can be added at this time and worked well. Add nuts and flavoring. Make into rolls and wrap in waxed paper.

NOTE: I like using Penuche Fudge for the center of Pecan Logs. I think this brown sugar fudge. The caramel and pecans work very well with it.

1 cube butter or margarine

4 cups granulated sugar

4 tsp. vanilla

30-oz. bag white chips or morsels

1 tall can evaporated milk

16-oz. bag miniature

marshmallows

12-oz. can honey roasted

peanuts

Combine butter, evaporated milk, and sugar in a heavy saucepan. Bring to a full rolling boil over medium heat, stirring constantly. Remove from heat. Stir in marshmallows, morsels, 2/3 of the peanuts, and vanilla. Stir vigorously until marshmallows and morsels are melted. Pour onto a buttered 1/2-sheet cookie sheet. Coarsely chop remaining peanuts. Sprinkle over fudge and press in. Chill until firm.



Enough is enough.




Santa. In December 1957, CONAD became the North American Aerospace Defense Command, (NORAD), and volunteers at NORAD have been
